BRIS (Children’s Rights in Society) is a non-profit organization, with no political or religious affiliation, that works for the rights of children and young people. The organization consists of two main branches: the direct aid arm, where BRIS works as a link between children, adults, and society; and an opinion-forming side. The organization’s headquarters is in Stockholm, Sweden, and it has five local offices in the country.

Challenges

- Reduce the time it takes to collect data and create reports

Solution
