Support from Oracle will also ensure access to digital technology, workbooks and age-appropriate content in the classrooms.
2.	Swades Foundation	Enhance rural livelihoods and promote sustainable agriculture through training and interventions focused on cultivation of high-value crops. 4.	MAMTA - Health Institute for Mother & Child (HIMC)	Support for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) education programs, including STEM centers and science libraries in schools, to develop the next generation of innovators, critical thinkers and problem solvers. A grant from Oracle will also build the capacity of teachers, students and parents as change agents who improve educational outcomes.
5.	Samarthanam Trust for the Disabled	Provide vocational and life skills education for children with disabilities, building digital literacy and soft skills, and supporting future job placement. A grant from Oracle will also

		provide individual education plans (IEPs) and assistive devices for the children, as well as counselling for parents.
6.	Foundation to Educate Girls Globally	Support the Primary Organic program which aims to improve enrolment, retention and learning among at-risk, out-of-school girls in marginalized communities. A grant from Oracle will fund life skills training for adolescent girls through Bal Sabhas (Girls' Councils), training of teachers and school management committees, as well as support for in-school remedial learning curriculum.
7.	Breakthrough Trust	Support Taaron Ki Toli (Adolescent girls' advancement) program, a two-year school- and community-based initiative that equips adolescent girls and young women with leadership and life skills. A grant from Oracle will train teachers to promote positive and respectful behaviours in the classroom, and support school management committees in implementing gender sensitization curriculum in schools. The program also engages adolescent boys, young adults, parents, and community members to build an ecosystem where girls can thrive and reach their full potential.
8.	BHUMI	Support the Fellowship program, which aims to improve the quality of education by placing young educators and changemakers in the classroom at underserved government and private schools. A grant from Oracle supports a variety of interventions to develop fundamental literacy and numeracy through STEM curriculum development and teacher capacity building.
9.	Swayam Shikshan Prayog	Support underserved women farmers and entrepreneurs through training on best practices for dairy farming, agriculture and multi-cropping, livestock management, and financial literacy. A grant from Oracle will help women gain basic entrepreneurship skills, as well as access to credit and market opportunities.
10.	Hyderabad Eye Institute: L V Prasad Eye Institute	Support underserved young adults to build careers as eye care professionals, increasing their livelihood opportunities. A grant from Oracle will recruit and train vision technicians and ophthalmic nurse assistants. Participants will also receive basic training on treating cataract.

12.	Indian Cancer Society	Support for early detection and treatment of cancer through awareness building, cancer screenings in vulnerable communities, and funding for patient treatment. A grant from Oracle will also provide nutritional supplement kits to low-income patients recovering from cancer, as well as raise awareness of the importance of nutrition amongst these patients.
13.	Vrutti	Support Self-Help Groups (SHGs) of underserved women by connecting them with income-generating opportunities, teaching entrepreneurial skills, and promoting financial self-sufficiency. A grant from Oracle will support enterprise development training, market linkages, capacity building, and opportunities to collaborate with existing women farmers and collectives.
14.	Team Everest	Deliver group training and individual mentoring to underserved girls, focused on critical thinking, technology skills, and job readiness. A grant from Oracle will support the development of a technical platform to deliver mentor training and enhance communication between mentors and students.
15.	SARD (Society for All Round development)	Provide STEM education for underserved students by leveraging a combination of technology and innovative pedagogy. A grant from Oracle will support the development of age-appropriate curriculum, science libraries, and STEM labs focused on coding, astronomy, and virtual reality to foster curiosity and hands-on learning.
16.	Going to School Fund	Support STEM and life skills programs for girls ages 7-17. A grant from Oracle will help girls learn how to tackle issues facing their community through engaging sessions focused on play, problem solving, and design thinking.
