

Oracle Cloud Native Environment

Oracle Cloud Native Environment is software for configuring, deploying, updating, and upgrading infrastructure for running cloud native applications. It is based on open standards, specifications, and APIs defined by the Open Container Initiative and Cloud Native Computing Foundation (CNCF), including a CNCF-certified Kubernetes module, container runtimes, virtualization, service mesh, storage, networking, observability, and diagnostics.

Software features

Oracle Cloud Native Environment provides an integrated set of components to deploy, manage, and scale container-based applications for on-premises, in the cloud, and at the edge. Oracle closely tracks CNCF projects as well as the Open Container Initiative and contributes to and abides by the standards defined by both. For example, Oracle delivers the tools to create and provision Open Container Initiative compliant containers.

- Includes the Kubernetes software and is released under the [CNCF Certified Kubernetes Conformance](#) program.
- Simplifies the configuration and setup of Kubernetes with support for backup and recovery.
- Thanks to the built-in [KubeVirt technology](#), provides a unified development platform where developers can build, modify, and deploy applications residing in both application containers and virtual machines in a common, shared environment.
- Relies on the [native Kubernetes container runtime interface](#), CRI-O, and provides two runtime engines, runC and Kata Containers.
- Provides Istio [service mesh to coordinate communication](#) between services, providing service discovery, load balancing, security, recovery, telemetry, and policy enforcement capabilities. Istio uses a sidecar service mesh model powered by the Envoy proxy.
- Supplies Prometheus, a powerful, flexible, instrumentation solution for [monitoring container environments](#). It provides time-series dimensional data, powerful query tools, and alerting features to improve visibility across the environment.
- Storage integration is provided through plug-ins and is referred to as the [Container Storage Interface \(CSI\)](#). The plug-ins adhere to a standard specification and include the Oracle Cloud Infrastructure Cloud Controller Manager module to set up dynamically provisioned persistent storage using Oracle Cloud Infrastructure and the Rook Container Storage Interface module to set up dynamically provisioned persistent storage using Ceph Storage for Oracle Linux.
- The [Container Network Interface \(CNI\)](#) project, currently incubating under CNCF, seeks to simplify networking for container workloads by defining a common framework for dynamically configuring networking

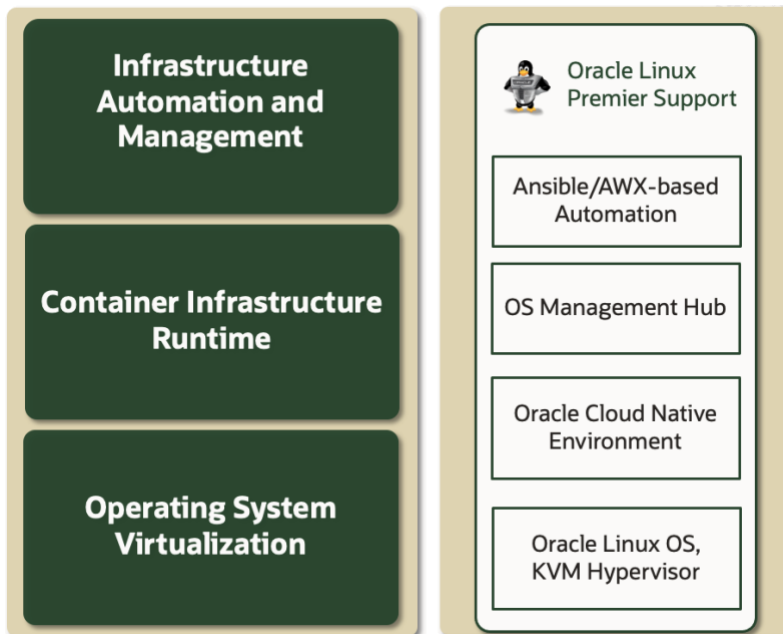

Updates and errata are freely available, excluding certain updates and errata such as those released with Ksplice and Extended Support, which may require [Oracle Linux Premier](#) or [Extended Support](#).

It is all included in the price of a single subscription. Users can run Oracle Cloud Native Environment on the host and as many Oracle Linux guest instances as desired without additional cost. Container images can be downloaded via [Oracle Container Registry](#), [GitHub Container Registry](#) or [Docker Hub](#) and deployed to Oracle Cloud Native Environment.
