Non-Supported Zimbra™ Features in Oracle Beehive Webmail

Release 2 (2.0)

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Oracle Beehive Webmail is a Web-based e-mail application providing Oracle Beehive users with a Web-based alternative to access, view, and manage e-mail, calendaring, and address books. Some features of the Zimbra Web Client are not supported by Beehive, nor are considered part of the Oracle Beehive Webmail product.

Beehive Webmail is built using the Zimbra™ Open source Web client. "Beehive Webmail Client" is used throughout this document to refer to the Zimbra Web application itself.

Beehive-Specific Features

For a list of topics which do not apply to (and therefore are not supported by) Beehive, see the following section.

Zimbra Features and Concepts *Not Supported* by Oracle Beehive

The following features or concepts do **not** apply to Oracle Beehive Webmail:

- Instant Messaging (Beta)
- Working in Documents
- Using Briefcases
- Creating Filters (for routing incoming e-mail messages to designated folders)
- Conversation View (threaded) for messages
- Import/export

- contact lists
- other calendar programs
- Setting up different account identities and addresses (for managing roles)
- Configuring accounts (to receive e-mail from other POP3 or IMAP accounts)
- Additional features not supported by Beehive:
 - Setting a forwarding address
 - Subscribing to RSS/Atom Feeds
 - Receiving new mail notifications
 - Adding external accounts
 - Using spell check
 - Creating personas/e-mail identities
 - Changing your default time zone

The following areas may differ from Beehive functionality:

- Sharing Mail Folders
- Setting up desktop alerts
 - Beehive displays calendar alerts only
- Responding to a meeting invite
 - Beehive displays the invitation differently in your Inbox than described in Beehive Webmail Client Help.
- Search
 - Advanced Search is less comprehensive in Oracle Beehive Webmail than described in Beehive Webmail Client Help.
- Terms and usage
 - Some terminology for the Sharing feature in Oracle Beehive Webmail differs from Beehive Webmail Client

Note: Other high-level topics of the Beehive Webmail Help may contain content describing various feature-level differences (such as setting a priority on e-mail) which are not supported in Oracle Beehive Webmail.

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
